Policies

One of your students comes to you near the end of the semester asking for an Incomplete because "she'll lose her scholarship if she fails your class". What would be an appropriate response? Give justification.

Personally, I would say that the grade given in the course measures the student's performance in the course, and I would not grant the I. Moreover, the IRM does make it clear that an I will not be granted when the student would fail regardless of success or failure on the remaining work.

Immediately, I would move the student to another seat, at the front of the room. After the test is over, I would schedule a faculty-student conference and notify the student of that fact.
